Most importantly, we have responded to the desire to live in a safe and friendly neighborhood, and CALL THE POLICE because we will NOT TOLERATE CRIME!

ALERT!

At our last meeting a neighbor shared with us news of someone gaining access to a neighbor's home while the owner was there! Someone came to the door saying they were from a cable company and needed to check the pole in the back yard and asked if they could come through the house to get to the back yard. The homeowner had NOT called the cable company. The person may have seemed nice enough and said they were sorry to trouble him and would only take a moment of his time. The homeowner took the person through his house to the backyard. The front door was left UNlocked, by either the homeowner or even possibly by the imposter. That's how a second person easily entered the house. While the homeowner and the imposter were in the back yard this person stole things from the house.

If the cable company or anyone else really does need access to your yard you can direct them to the side of the house where you can let them in. **Be sure the front door remains locked.** Do NOT let anyone into your home who you do not know or have not called for service. If they say they need to use your phone, offer to make the call for them while they wait outside. (A person who really does need a phone call made will be grateful for your kindness; it's just as risky for them to enter a stranger's house as it is for you to let a stranger in.)

For people claiming to need access to your home, make note of their physical appearance including clothing, hairstyle, facial features, etc. Also note characteristics of anyone who may be with them, and a description of the vehicle. Call the police immediately and report your observations.

A Crime Report form to guide you in getting the details of your observations has been included in a previous newsletter and is available at our meetings. You can also get a copy off our website at http://www.gardenacircle.com/CrimeReport.html Print out a few copies and keep them by the phone so you have them ready if you need them.

MARCH REVIEW

Last month's newsletter featured important details in 'Reporting a Crime' and 'Calling 9-1-1' provided by the National Neighborhood Watch Institute. **Sgt. Medrano** followed up on this at the meeting by playing a recording of a 9-1-1 call. In listening to the recording it was obvious how difficult it can be for the operator, dispatcher and officers in the field to ensure they are getting accurate information. It is imperative you stay on the line answering the questions you are asked, even if you are asked the same question more than once. The communication is going from you to at least three other destinations (it can get hectic!) and everyone needs to have the correct information. Only you can clarify when there are questions.
