His successful leadership echoes in the professionalism of the men and women of the GPD; his commitment to Community Oriented Policing has created new neighborhood watch groups; and to support his vision for a more responsive police department he assembled the Chief of Police Citizen's Advisory Panel creating a direct link between the GPD and the residential and business community. Although his time in Gardena has been brief, Chief Skogh's passion has imprinted the future of the Gardena Police Department and the community. A neighbor spotted the car matching the description, called the police, and four suspects were taken into custody. Neighborhood watch does make a difference and email is a tool we can use to quickly share information.

GARDENA HIGH SCHOOL SHOOTING

Last month FLORENCE CHUNG, Community Organizer for American Asian Drug and Alcohol Prevention, Inc. (AADAP) and Gardena Drug and Alcohol Prevention (GDAAP), was scheduled to present at our meeting. However, the shooting at Gardena High School prompted the first of several community meetings starting that night which Florence attended. Her deep relationship with the Gardena High students through High School Task Force (HSTF) and the fact that one of the HSTF students was shot put her at the heart of efforts to change things at Gardena High School. She continues to be involved with the groups that have evolved from the initial community meeting. We look forward to rescheduling Florence for a future neighborhood watch meeting.

GANG PRESENTATION

Gangs and gang crime and violence are growing. It is not just a problem in other cities but in Gardena as well. The GPD has officers on full-time detail dedicated to addressing gang activity. Efforts of Gardena's Gang Prevention Unit and joint activities with other departments will be presented by SGT. MEDRANO.
